# The Preacher's Post - Darin Kennedy

Last week, I had my first class on the Minor Prophets, and we talked about the book of Jonah. I was startled by several things in the book, but I was most startled by how much I am like Jonah. Jonah knows his Bible. The second chapter of Jonah is the prayer he speaks to God while in the belly of the fish, and it is a conglomeration of quotations from the Psalms. He quotes from or alludes to several of them, including Psalm 116: "The cords of death entangled me, the anguish of the grave came over me; I was overcome by distress and sorrow. Then I called on the name of the Lord: 'Lord, save me!" (Psalm 116:3-4). In the first chapter of Jonah, as the storm rages and the sailors inquire about Jonah's identity, he speaks a clear theology: "I am a Hebrew and I worship the Lord, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land" (Jonah 1:9). Jonah has all the right knowledge in his head, but he still runs at the beginning, and he still gets angry enough to die when the Ninevites repent. If Jonah is so well equipped, why then does he fail?

The answer lies within Jonah, within the deep recesses of the heart that are revealed in the stress of the storm, in the belly of the fish, and in the oppressive burden of the heat of the day. He may know what the Lord says, but Jonah is rebellious against God and hates the people God has created. Jonah is fine when all those pretty verses about salvation and a God who hears and a God who forgives are all for him, but he does not like to share the goodness of God: "I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God (also found in Psalm 116:5), slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity. Now, Lord, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live" (Jonah 4:3-4). Did you hear that? He says, "God you are so compassionate that I wish I could die." When God's goodness is shared with people that Jonah hates, then Jonah is angry.

If knowledge is not implanted in humility, then it cannot bear fruit. If knowledge is always filtered through my own prejudices, plans, and desires, then I will pick and choose not only what to believe, but also how, when, where, and to whom it should be applied. It is the essence of idolatry—to make God into what I want Him to be. Where is the selfishness of our faith exposed? Is it when the storms of life rage? Is it when the heat is unbearable? Is it when we have to share a room or street with ungodly Ninevites?
