The Preacher's Post – Darin Kennedy

I have a saying that should be put next to the best of Benjamin Franklin: "Love covers a multitude of sins, and so does a lawnmower."

My yard has more than its fair share of crab grass and dandelions, and I am jealous of the other yards on my street. However, there is one day when I take my place among them—mowing day. Once a week, my yard is green and smooth like theirs. Even weeds can give the perception of grass when they are cut down. After I mow, I enjoy taking a walk and finding a little dandelion or a tuft of crab grass in someone else's yard. It is my one day of victory.

Anger can be like the lawnmower. We are tempted to use anger to get rid of our problem areas. If we yell loud enough or fight hard enough, we can mow down the things that plague us. If we are aggressive enough, we can eliminate the distance between our lives and our neighbors' lives. A strong sense of judgment and indignation gives the appearance of control, demanding some respect and honor. One can end the argument, enjoying the honored position of having "the last word."

However, the dandelion shows the futility of my lawnmower. Sure, for a moment I have victory, but they continue in their deception. They lie down, limp and lifeless, pretending to be dead. But we know what happens. The very next day, the dandelions stand right back up. They may even have their heads chopped off, but they stand tall as if to say, "I have no concerns. I'll grow a new head—a nice, fluffy, white one with lots of pretty seeds [Please insert evil, maniacal laugh]!" Crab grass is so pretty when cut, but within hours, it grows out its ugly tendrils right onto my pretty sidewalk. Anger also proves itself to be temporary, only disguising and even propagating the problems.

No, the only solution is to combat evil with what goes to the root of the problem. Love is the only thing that can reach way down deep and kill off what is troubling. I am amazed to watch God handle His weeds. God does have to burn the field at times, to start over with a new planting; however, His primary weed-killer is an incredibly patient love. His choice is to win us over with love, to replace our desire for sin with desire for Him. The lawns of our lives are filled with the deception of sin, and God nurtures and nourishes the healthy grass until it chokes out the unwelcome guests.
