## A Minister's Musings – Shane Hall

Why Small Groups? If you and your family are looking for a great way to connect, serve, and study, this is a question we encourage you to seriously ask yourself. As the ever-growing Body of Christ (Eph. 1:22-23), we should always be on the lookout for ways to add "make your calling and election sure" (2 Pet. 1:10). The leadership here at Blue River has prayerfully considered and begun creating three new small groups that are designed to feed this flock in a few specific ways.

First, it is important to be together. Some may be convinced that an hour of fellowship per week is all we need. Others may say, "An hour per week is just about all the time I have to give." Our time is valuable to us. We all have deadlines and commitments that leave us with little free time. In truth, however, our meeting together should become one of our commitments, instead of left for free time. As part of our transformation into the image of Christ, we should desire more and more to be together. I'm always reminded of the first Christians and how important it was for them to be near each other. When the church began, a pilgrimage to a central location once a year stopped being enough. We can do so much when we are together: prayer, study, service, encouragement, and benevolence being just a few of the great works that can be done.

Second, we can study God's word together. There is something about joint participation when studying scripture. Being able to use your brothers and sisters in Christ as sounding boards is very beneficial. How exciting it must have been to get a letter from Paul the Apostle! Upon receiving these letters, the church would read them before passing them along to another body of believers (1 Thess. 5:27; Col. 4:16). When it comes to studying God's word, you receive a wonderful blessing from being around people of like faith. In addition, you could be that blessing to someone else!

Finally, being together is an important example. As a parent I am constantly aware of the example I am setting for my children. Granted, my example is not always one I want them to see, but I want them to visualize a pattern of good works. My children are not the only ones watching. I wish many of my relatives and friends could see the great benefits that Christ's church can provide. A small, intimate group setting, where people are seeking the betterment of one another and where the truth is being spoken in love, is perhaps the best (or at least the most genuine) way for my children and others to witness how marvelous the church can be. I don't want people to look into my life and see church as an extracurricular activity; I want my story to read very clearly that church is what I do first and when they follow that example I can point them to the cross.

Why small groups? Ultimately you must answer the question for you and yours. Maybe the better question would be, *why not*?
